# **FEBRUARY 4, 2024**



In today's Gospel, the healings of Jesus are numerous. Peter's mother-in-law after she had been healed by Jesus - "...the fever left her, and she waited on them" -- today's Gospel teaches us that true discipleship means getting involved in giving selfless service to others. Jesus' first day of public ministry at Capernaum was a Sabbath day. During the day, he had taken part in the synagogue worship, taught with authority, exorcised a demon, and healed Simon's mother-in-law. After all that, when the sun had set, he "cured many who were sick with various diseases and drove out many demons." Thus, Jesus spent himself and most of his time ministering to the needs of others, bringing healing, forgiveness, and a new beginning to many. Yet, he understood even the most important work had to be continually refueled and evaluated before God his Father. Hence, Jesus rose very early the next morning and went off "to a deserted place" to pray to assess his work for his Father's glory and to recharge his spiritual batteries. We need to be instruments for Jesus' healing work. Bringing healing and wholeness is Jesus' ministry even today. We all need healing for our minds, our memories, and our broken relationships. In his life there was time for prayer, time for healing, and time for reconciliation. Let us take up this challenge by sharing love, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness with others. Instead of considering life as dull and pointless, let us live our lives as Jesus did, full of dynamism and zeal for the glory of God. Laudetur Jesus Christus ! Fr. Felician

We know from last week's Gospel that Jesus gathered and prayed with the Com-munity in the synagogue. Today we learn that Jesus also took the time to pray

alone. Following the example of Jesus, we also pray together with our community, and we take the time to pray alone. Our children observe our prayer with others. We might want to take the opportunity to talk with them about our private prayer, however, so that through our example, they may learn to make private prayer an important part of their daily lives. Gather as a family and talk about the ways in which your family prays together (at Mass, grace before meals, bedtime prayers). Invite each member of the family to talk about his or her private prayer: When do you pray? Where do you pray? How do you pray? What do you pray for?

Jesus modeled for us a life of prayer. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 1:29-39. Talk about this Gospel with your family. Ask questions such as the following: What do you think Jesus was praying about in today's Gospel? What guidance have you received from God in prayer? Conclude by asking God to bless

our times of prayer so that we can know and follow God's ways. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

#### "I am the bread of life." John 6:51

We continue our reflection on the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass. Catholicism professes that during the Consecration, a miracle occurs - the priest consecrates the bread and wine: Just as Jesus did at the Last Supper, the priest takes the bread in the form of a Host and says, "This is my body." Then he elevates the Host for the congregation to see, the bells are rung three times in our parish, to alert everyone of what has taken place, and then the priest genuflects. Then the priest takes the chalice (cup) of wine, saying, "This is the cup of My Blood," elevates the chalice, once again the bells are rung three times, and the priest genuflects. Now it's the body and blood of Christ; it still looks, feels, tastes like bread and wine, but it's not. This change of bread and wine into the true presence of Jesus' Body and Blood is called "transubstantiation." The Bible says that God created merely by speaking. "God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light." (Genesis 1:3) Likewise, by invoking the Holy Spirit, by speaking the words of Christ at the last supper over the bread and wine during Holy Communion, the priest changes them into the body and blood, soul and divinity of Christ through the authority given to him by the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Only an ordained priest has the authority to say Mass and consecrate the bread and wine. Sincerely, Fr. Felician
