



February 11th is **World Day of the Sick**, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. The day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes. People around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick on this day. Faith organizations mark this day specially to provide the sick with medicines, food, and spiritual guidance. Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day.

We will offer a special **Mass at 10:00AM** St. Michael in Newark on Saturday, February 11th, for those who would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please come and help support those parishioners who are present with us and have an illness. Please join us in prayer also for those who cannot be with us. Lastly, not to be forgotten, let's also pray for those who are sick in our world and have no one to request prayers for them. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us! Praised be Lord Jesus Christ !!!

What does the Sacrament of the Sick do?

"Illness can lead to anguish, self-absorption, sometimes even despair and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him." (Catechism of the Catholic Church 1501)

Who can receive Anointing of the Sick?

Anointing of the Sick should be administered to anyone that begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age and also just prior to a serious operation. This sacrament is reserved like the Eucharist, for Catholics who are in a state of grace, that is, those who have been recently to the Sacrament of Confession. There, however, are no limits for the sacrament. It can be repeatedly given to someone if his/her condition becomes worse, as well as, for the elderly whose frailty becomes worse.





Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I recently decided to learn to cook. As I sit at the feet of various YouTube cooking masters, I notice how much of cooking is adding ingredients that don't provide any more nourishment, like herbs and other seasonings. But man! They make all the difference because they make the meal delightful to eat and share.

Jesus calls his disciples "salt of the world." No one eats just salt. So, Christians are not meant to replace or do away with the world. They are meant to be agents of preservation and glorification. Notice how often these days the Church seeks to preserve what is threatened: the goodness of marital and family love, the desires of young people for greatness, the value of honest work, healthy economics, and altruistic political engagement, the dignity of the poor and vulnerable. Over and over, we say to a world who wants to throw things out, "It's worth saving! We'll preserve it! We'll show you it's wonderful." If we can't engage the world like that, Jesus says we are the ones who get thrown out, because salt alone is worthless.

Jesus only asks us to do for others what he does for us. He is the "salt" of everything in our lives. Is there something in your life starting to rot a bit? Something tasting bland and boring? Let Jesus salt it and see if you like it better.

Building Strong Catholic Families

The widespread use of electricity in our society may make us less aware of the value and importance of light. Gather your family in a darkened room. Bring only one flashlight. Sit together for a minute and consider what you can do and see in so little light. Turn on the flashlight and experiment to see how one might use it to achieve the greatest amount of light. Then read today's Gospel by the light of the flashlight. Ask everyone to consider what it means to say that Christians are to be the light of the world. How might your family act in a way that is a light for others, a light that is worthy to put on a lamp stand? Choose one thing that your family will do this week to show that you are the light of the world.

A Year of Coming to Know God

Imagine you've been charged with the crime of stealing millions of dollars from a bank and losing it all at a casino and let's say you did it. You're guilty. And now you're in court. And then let's say the Judge is the same person as your Defense Lawyer! The guy who's going to judge you is the same guy who's working to get you off the hook! And then, even more unbelievably, Judge/Defense Lawyer announces to the court: "Also, regarding that money the defendant just lost – that doesn't need to concern the court any longer. I just paid it all back to the bank out of my own pocket." Can you imagine your gratitude to this man?

That's what Jesus is to us:

1. He's the one who made up for our sin with His Death and Resurrection.
2. He's the one who intercedes on our behalf after the Ascension.
3. He's the one who will be our Judge at the end of our lives.


