

Lent 2023

The season of Lent is almost upon us. Ash Wednesday is next week, February 22. It seems like only a few short days ago we were celebrating Christmas. Its amazing how quickly time passes.

We all know the three basic tenets of Lent: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. We will hear Jesus speak about them in the Gospel on Ash Wednesday. Prayer is the act of communicating with the Lord in order to deepen one's relationship with Him. Fasting is the act of giving up food and other goods as a spiritual practice to draw oneself closer to God. Almsgiving is the act of offering money and other worldly goods to the poor and those most in need. All of these are vital to our Lenten journey, but there is more even than this. Lent is a penitential season, an opportunity for all of us to reorient our lives and rededicate ourselves to love of God and our neighbor. Lent is an inward journey as well as an outward journey that we take together with our brothers and sisters in Christ. Before his ministry began, Jesus spent 40 days wandering in the desert, fasting and praying, preparing himself for the mission that he was about to take. It wasn't until that journey was completed that Jesus was finally ready to reveal himself and begin the next journey, a journey that would eventually lead to Calvary and the Cross. Lent is an opportunity to take that 40-day journey together with Christ, leading ultimately to our commemoration of Christ's death on the Cross.

As we pray, fast, and give alms this Lent, may we continue to remember all those who suffer and struggle on a daily basis throughout the world. I pray that during this season we all continue to grow closer to the Lord our God and that we may continue to strengthen the bonds of love that connect all of God's children on Earth.







Building Strong Catholic Families

Families have rules. Without rules, family life would be chaos. As a family, brainstorm a list of rules that you are all called to follow in your home in order for you all to get along together. Think about rules for play time, rules for eating, rules for how to speak to one another, rules for going out with friends, and so on. Emphasize that families follow rules as a way of showing love and respect for one another. Explain that in this Sunday’s Gospel, Jesus talks about following the Law. Say: God’s Law of love can be thought of as rules that we are to follow in order to show our love and respect for one another. Read aloud this Sunday’s Gospel, Matthew 5:17–37. Talk specifically with one another about how anger is to be dealt with in your family. Conclude by praying for the grace to overcome anger and to show respect for one another as a family by following God’s Law of love.

A Year of Coming to Know God

Over the centuries, skeptics have tried to attack the credibility of the resurrection, but the Resurrection still stands as the great proof of Christ’s divinity:

- a. The story wasn’t made up generations later – Paul says there are, in his day, many living witnesses to the risen Christ (I Corinthians 15:6).
- b. The apostles didn’t hallucinate – even the Pharisees and Romans admitted the tomb was empty
- c. Jesus didn’t fake His death – if He had He would have eventually died anyway, instead of ascending on a cloud.
- d. The apostles didn’t steal the body and lie – most of them were martyred for their faith, and no one in history ever died for something they knew was a hoax.

Jesus truly died, and truly rose. This is called the Paschal Mystery. By baptism, we enter this paschal mystery And by God’s grace, and our free cooperation, we enter the paschal mystery ever more deeply So that when our bodies die, it will be in union with Christ – and when our bodies rise, it will be to eternal life with God






If you enjoy the Euchre nights at St. Michael’s in Newark... check out the Knights of Columbus Euchre Tournament Fund-raiser in Waterloo.
