Fr. Mike's Message...

Season of Sacraments

Every year, at the Easter Vigil, the Church welcomes new members into the flock. Those who have been preparing throughout the year (or longer) are officially initiated into the Church at the Vigil by receiving the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. This year, our cluster of parishes welcomed four new members. But what is so wonderful about the Easter season is that, in many ways, it is a season full of Sacramental firsts.

May is the month of Mary, it's the month we celebrate Mother's day (Happy Mother's Day to all!), and its also the month when many receive some of the Sacraments for the first time. It is often in May that "wedding season" starts. We often have infant baptisms this time of year as well. However, the sacraments that I want to focus on the most are the ones for which our young people have been preparing for the last year (or two): First Communion and Confirmation.

Over the last several weeks, a number of youth in our Parishes have celebrated the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Communion) for the first time, as well as the Sacrament of Confirmation. These two sacraments are very important milestones in the lives of young people growing up in the Catholic faith. At the age of 7, the Church recognizes that most children are able to understand right from wrong, as well as understand who Jesus is and what we celebrate at Mass. The Church refers to this as the Age of Reason, and we invite children at this age to prepare to receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time. For those who are a little older, the Church recognizes that children in their teens are mature enough to profess the Catholic faith on their own, a faith that was originally professed for them by their parents and Godparents when they were infants. Thus, the Church invites those teens who are ready to prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. The preparation period for these Sacraments is substantial. For the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist, the kids have been preparing all year, while those receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation have been preparing for the last two years. It is a great blessing to have our young people growing in and learning the faith, and I want to take this opportunity to congratulate them on their hard work and dedication. I also want to thank the parents and sponsors who have been walking with these kids on their journey together, as well as our wonderful Catechists who have put in a lot of hard work in guiding them all along the way.

As I have stated before, I ask that you continue to keep these kids in your prayers as their faith lives continue to grow and blossom. Both sacraments are meant to mark new chapters in a child's life, and we as a Church are all called to help our young people continue their journey of faith together as one.

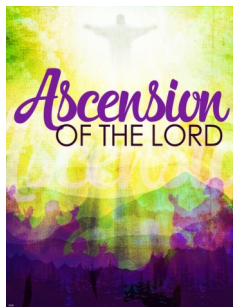

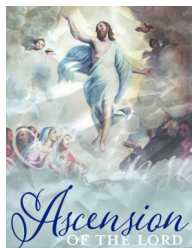

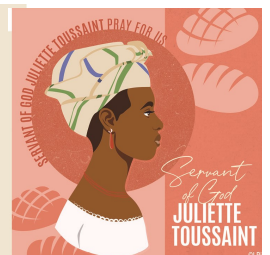

Building Strong Catholic Families

The mystery of the Trinity can be difficult for us to grasp. Today's Gospel invites us to consider how the three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—work together so that God's salvation is made known to us. Jesus' mission is continued through the activity of the Holy Spirit in the lives of his disciples. We have received this same Spirit through our Baptisms. The Spirit, living and working within us, reveals the mystery of God's love for us. Just as the first disciples were not left orphaned, we are not orphaned; we remain in God's embrace through the gift of the Holy Spirit. Gather your family and invite each family member to say what he or she knows about the Holy Spirit. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we come to share in the love of God made known to us in Jesus. Pray together, thanking God for this gift of the Holy Spirit by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.

A Year of Coming to Know God

On the Cross, Jesus conquered death itself – which means that death no longer has the power to divide those who remain connected to Him that's why we talk about the "Communion of Saints" – the community of all those who love and follow Christ – whether in this life or the next.

The Souls in Heaven ("The Church Triumphant")

If we die in a state of grace – in a state of friendship with God – we will ultimately reach Heaven. This is the fulfillment of all desire – seeing God face-to-face (1 Corinthians 13:12), as He is, and realizing that He is the source of all perfection and all happiness. We will also enjoy the eternal, glorious company of Our Lady and all the angels and the saints. Here's an exercise: think of the five happiest moments of your life so far – then imagine that feeling being even more intense and lasting forever. That'll make you want to go to Heaven.
