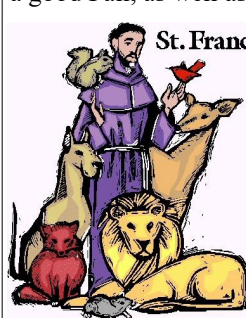

St. Francis

This Saturday, October 8th, at 10 AM at Lyons Central Park we will have a celebration called the Blessing of the Animals. Everyone is invited to bring their pets to the park for a blessing.

This is in honor of the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi. He is considered the patron saint of animals and the environment. In his memory, the Church celebrates his feast day on October 4th.

Francis recognized that animals share in the lives of people in ways that human beings do not. Our pets are a gift from God. They become part of our lives. They bring us companionship, loyalty and unconditional love. He went so far as to call all animals his brothers and sisters. For the owners, these animals are truly a blessing. Come and have your pet blessed. For those that attend, they will have quite the tail to tell!

In early October, we are beginning our new Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) Campaign. Our goals are: St. Michael's -Newark \$39,000 ; St. Joseph the Worker - \$32,000 ; Catholic Community of Blessed Trinity - \$16,500.

Last year at St. Michael's we had, 192 parishioners donating \$36,220, at St. Joseph the Worker, 148 parishioners donating \$23,411 and at Catholic Community of Blessed Trinity 72 parishioners donating \$16,900.

Thank you for your support of the ministries of the Church across the Diocese, including Catholic Charities, the Neuman Centers (RIT & U of R Catholic Chaplaincy), and the Faith Formation program that supports our seminarians - especially George Bastedo from Clyde.

I am personally asking that each parishioner make a pledge to the CMA. We will achieve our goal by the generosity of our parish family. If each family prayerfully considers a modest pledge of a comfortable amount they can give, we will make our goal by Christmas! As always, thank you for your generous support.

I appreciate all of you who have come back, physically, to the Church and all of you who are giving time and treasure to our parishes.

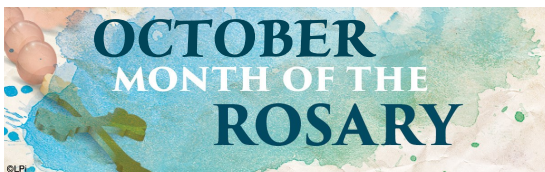

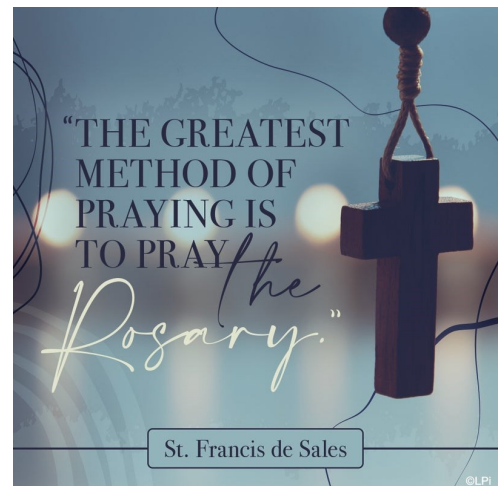

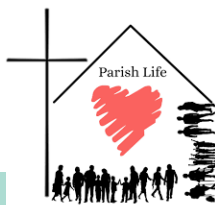

**What is the Christian attitude towards violent conflicts?**

In the Beatitudes, Jesus teaches us "Blessed are the peacemakers" and to "love your enemies." All human beings are made in God's image and likeness. We are one human family — brothers and sisters despite what divides us. Christians have the obligation to prioritize peaceful means to resolve conflicts. War wreaks a toll on a nation. Civilians bear a disproportionate burden of this cost during the war itself and as the nation rebuilds. However, those in authority have the obligation to protect the innocent.

During the gradual fall of the Roman Empire, theologians began to theorize that war could be just if it was a defensive measure of last resort. The "Just War Theory" was later expanded by St. Thomas Aquinas, who also included moral obligations during the war itself, including the protection of civilians. Those in public authority have the obligation to carefully examine their motives, agendas, and rationale for violent force. Should a cause be just, those who fight and defend under such circumstances must be valued and honored. They deserve our support both during and after the war.





Building Strong Catholic Families

Every child and indeed every person deals with peer pressure to some extent in their lives. There is a desire to “fit in” to be “cool”. Sometimes when we bend to peer pressure it is to the detriment of our faith and can lead us to sin. St. Paul is encouraging us to be courageous in our faith because the Holy Spirit lives in us. As parents how do we model courageous faith to our children? How can we help our children grow in faith, that they become courageous so they will not be ashamed to testify on behalf of our Lord?

A Year of Coming to Know God

There are three steps or phases of coming to know God First, we can know about God through our own reason. This knowledge isn't very clear, but it's enough to know that God is unique, and the most important thing there is. Secondly, God comes to introduce Himself directly through revelation. He tells us who He is and invites us into a relationship with Himself. Thirdly, by faith, we accept God's revelation, and our personal relationship with Him begins.

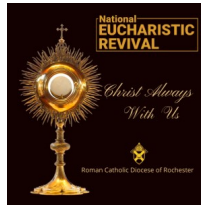
